This course meets the following mandated training requirements: Emergency Medical Response Training and certification – (4hrs. + 2hrs Scenario)

Course: This course will be an interactive training which will enable police officers to provide lifesaving techniques to injured persons. This course will cover serious injuries/illness that are commonly witnessed by police officers and how to treat them with lifesaving skills. Training will be composed of lecture, question and answer, instructor demonstration and practical's.

Upon Completion of this training, students will be able to-

- Identify life threatening illness/injuries
- Utilize "self-aid/buddy aid" and be familiar with "medicine across the barrier"
- Preform lifesaving medical techniques to stabilize patients until further help arrives
- Deploy Narcan to opioid overdoses
- Better communicate and work with local medical providers
- Understand the emergency medical service (EMS) and their needs

Instructor: Justin Rottmann has 21 years in fire service and is currently employed by the Monarch Fire Protection District in Chesterfield, MO., as Captain/Paramedic. He also works for the Grantfork Police Department since 2003 and has been part of the ILEAS Region 8 SRT since 2012. He currently serves as the Tactical EMS Team Leader. Justin holds degrees in Fire Science with a master's degree in Fire Management and Homeland Security from SIU-Carbondale. In May of 2024 he received his Illinois Master Threat Master Instructor Certification.
