COURSE OVERVIEW: The purpose of this training is to provide employees and/or responding law enforcement personnel with basic cell extraction techniques that will increase offender compliance, reduce department liability, and reduce possibility of injury to both staff and offenders.

COURSE GOALS: By the end of the training officers will develop knowledge and skills in: Immediate vs Calculated use of force in a correctional setting. Cell extraction overview. Video/audio recording considerations. Single offender extraction procedures. Multiple offender extraction procedures. Excited delirium and positional asphyxia.
