PURPOSE OF THIS COURSE: This course has been designed for the purpose of addressing the issue of sexual abuse and assault from the point of the offender. The issue of sexual deviance is epidemic proportions in our society. All officers need to not only know the mechanics of this crime, but how the offender's thing, act and modulate this evil behavior into their psyche. How think will enhance the officer's ability to apprehend them and assist in the officer's prosecution.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Sexual abuse and assault are a large part of most police officer's workload. This course takes an often-ignored view of these crimes. It explores the crime from the viewpoint of the offender/ It will address the reasons why offenders commit sex crimes and thus gives the officer the advantage of knowledge. This increased knowledge will increase prosecution of these crimes.
