ILETSB – CIT – (Advanced) 1 Day Refresher

Course overview: This 8-hour, voluntary training program was created as a review for officers who have at least one year's experience as an active CIT officer. Participants in this course will review topics such as trouble shooting, legal updates, self-care, and community resources. They will also partake in valuable group exercises in de-escalation and active listening and review and refresh their skills in realistic scenario role play exercises.

Please note: Officers are required to have 1 year of experience as an active CIT officer.

Instructors: The course will be conducted by a diverse group of law enforcement and behavioral health professionals, including active CIT officers from various parts of the State of Illinois. An essential part of the CIT course is scenario-based skills training with crisis scenarios provided by trained professional actors. All scenarios are facilitated and evaluated by certified CIT officers.



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Non-Member Tuition: \$0. No tuition is required for this class due to grant funding by Crisis Intervention/Mental Health Grant.

MTU#10 Law Enforcement members who are under the <u>mandate</u> requirements will be given priority on state mandated courses and then MTU#10 local members. If it is <u>not a mandated</u> course, all MTU# 10 local members will be given registration preference until seven days prior to the date of class. After that date, registrations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of MTU status. *We cannot accept registrations from individual officers. All registrations must go through your Chief, Sheriff, or department training office, even if you are attending class on your own time.*

Cancellation: If a class must be canceled for any reason, every effort will be made to do so at least 2 weeks before the class is scheduled to begin. However, there are circumstances where last minute cancellation is out of our control. All officers who have been registered for training will be contacted at the email address given at registration, so please be sure to provide an email address which is checked often.
