## Modern High Risk Vehicle Traffic Stops

<u>Course Overview</u>: This course will introduce emerging tactics on high-risk vehicle stops, previously referred to as felony vehicle stops. Harnessing modern vehicle design, these tactics will enhance officer safety and emphasize the principles of time, distance, and cover to mitigate risk.

Students will understand and demonstrate a basic understanding of HRVS tactics and the importance of time, distance, and cover.

The scenario-based culminating training event will give students the opportunity to employ these tactics and foster critical thinking skills to safely resolve a multitude of complex problem sets. Instructors and students will debrief after each scenario to evaluate risk mitigation and available courses of action.

## **Course Objectives:**

- 1. Discuss the history, evolution, and lessons learned in past high-risk vehicle stop encounters.
- 2. Define the overall role, responsibility, and strategy of contact and cover.
- 3. Employ the principles of time, distance, and cover to mitigate risk.
- 4. Recognize the various dynamics of a modern high-risk vehicle stop.
- 5. Demonstrate and employ these principles during scenario-based training.

<u>Instructor:</u> Matt Marass has served as a civilian law enforcement officer since January of 2012. MTU #10 local member department officers will be given registration preference until seven days prior to the date of class. After that date, registrations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of MTU status. We cannot accept registrations from individual officers. All registrations must go through your Chief, Sheriff, or department training office, even if you are attending class on your own time.

**Cancellation:** If a class must be canceled for any reason, every effort will be made to do so at least 2 weeks before the class is scheduled to begin. However, there are circumstances where last minute cancellation is out of our control.
