# **Rescue Task Force – 8 Hours**

## July 12, 2025

This course has been approved by ILETSB for the following mandated training requirements: Law Concerning Stops, Searches, Use of Force (0.5 hrs.), Officer Safety Techniques (1 hr.), and Emergency Medical Response (6 hrs.), and De-Escalation Techniques (0.5 hrs.).

**Course:** This one-day, 8-hour course is designed to train police officers and firefighter/paramedics in the specialized skill sets necessary to perform the active threat rescue task force mission. Rescue Task Force will prepare police, fire, and EMS to operate together in the warm zone during an active threat situation. The class will provide them with the skill sets to rapidly perform critical life-saving measures and triage patients under the protection of law enforcement. This course is part of the Illinois Tactical Officers Association Tactical Patrol Officer (TPO) and is one of eight courses required to attain the TPO designation.

Who Should Attend: Rescue Task Force is essential for police, fire, and EMS.

**Course Prerequisites:** Law enforcement students need to have attended the Rapid Deployment end user course. Fire department personnel should have basic first aid training or above. There are no prerequisites for EMS personnel.

#### **Course Content:**

- Rescue Task Force tactics and strategies
- Movement as part of a Rescue Task Force team
- Concepts of tactical emergency treatment
- Zones of operation (cold, warm and hot)
- Equipment and identification requirements
- Interior and exterior patient collection points and patient movement protocols
- Deployment and firearms handling

#### Instructors:

The primary instructors for this course are Active Threat Master Instructors Bruce Liebe and Sheriff Paul Gann.



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**Non-Member Tuition:** There is no fee as this is a grant funded class.
