Solo Officer Response Rapid Deployment

This course has been approved by ILETSB for the following mandated training requirements: Civil Rights (1hr), De-escalation Techniques (0.50hr + 0.50hrs scenario), Law Concerning Stops, Searches, and the Use of Force (1.00hrs + 0.50hrs Scenario), Officer Safety Techniques, Including Cover, Concealment, and Time (5.50hrs + 4.50hrs scenario). Specialized Mandate in Active Threat Response (8.00hrs + 5.50hrs scenario)

Instructors: The primary instructors for this course are Active Threat Master Instructors Bruce Liebe and Sheriff Paul Gann.

Course: This one day, an 8-hour course is designed to teach officers proper techniques for solo officer response to active threat situations. The focus of this course is to provide officers with the knowledge and specialized tactical skills they will need to perform these tasks safely and efficiently. This course is part of the Illinois Tactical Officers Association Tactical Patrol Officer (TPO) and is one of eight courses required to attain the TPO designation.

Who Should Attend: Solo Officer Response is a must for all officers so that they may acquire the skills needed to safely and effectively perform a rapid deployment/immediate action to stop an ongoing active threat.

Course Content:

- To provide students with an understanding of law enforcement authority and the use of force laws.
- Identify and discuss theories and concepts of close quarter battle (CQB) and building search techniques.
- To familiarize students with hallway movements, room clearing and scanning techniques, the use of cover and concealment, and communication skills with officers, victims, and suspects, and demonstrate proper weapons control techniques.
- To identify and discuss use of force and safety priority issues related to rapid deployment/immediate action incidents, including immediate defense of life, law, police procedure, and establish safety priorities.
- To provide students with an inventory of appropriate equipment to be used when conducting these types of operations, including issues related to weapon and ammunition selection, and uniform and

identification requirements. their ability to perform building searching/room clearing operational skills sets.
