Breath Analysis Instrument Operator Course

COURSE OVERVIEW: This course is offered to state and local law enforcement agencies. It was designed by the IL State Police to prepare the breath alcohol operator for actual operation of the instrument. It will address such issues as laws surrounding DUI arrests, physiology, and pharmacology of alcohol in the human body, theories of breath testing, and operation of breath test instruments.

This program will be held during a one-day, 8-hour period (Reduced from 16-Hour to 8-Hour). Training will be delivered through lectures and practical exercises. Students must achieve 70% on a written examination administered by the Illinois State Police in order to be licensed as a Breath Analyzer Operator. Students may miss no more than 10% of class and still receive a certificate of training. All laboratory assignments must be satisfactorily completed.
