Authority (0.50hrs), Crisis Intervention (12hrs), Human Rights (7hrs), Legal Updates (2hrs), Officer Wellness/Mental Health (2hrs), Procedural Justice (4hrs), Use of Force: De-escalation Techniques (8hrs + 4hrs Scenario), Officer Safety (4hrs + 3hrs Scenario) and Crisis Intervention Team Training (40hrs + 7hrs Scenario)

**Course Overview:** This 40-hour program is designed to provide selected officers with specialized training on dealing with individuals in the community who have a mental illness or other behavioral disability. CIT officers are trained as resource specialists who can provide immediate response to calls involving a mental health crisis. The "team" concept refers to law enforcement involvement with stakeholder agencies, as well as interagency mutual assistance when appropriate.

**Topics Include:** \*Signs & Symptoms of Mental Illness \*Medical Conditions that Mimic Mental Illness \*Compliant Surrender & Tactical Response \*Child & Adolescent Disorders \*Autism/Mental Retardation \*Risk Assessment & Legal Issues \*Substance Abuse \*Psychotropic Medications \*Geriatric Issues & Considerations \*Police Response to Suspected Excited Delirium

**Restrictions:** CIT training requires communication skills & situational assessments that can only be developed after an officer has had field experience exposing him or her to the nature of interpersonal interactions with the public, a minimum of two years is now required before an officer may begin the general, 40-hour, CIT course.
