Course Overview: This course will begin with a brief lesson on common practices when dealing with the Emergency Room and EMS systems. Opioid overdose signs and symptoms will be reviewed with a demonstration in Narcan deployment. We will then go on to discuss best practices for preventable traumarelated deaths. The instructor will demonstrate the use of tourniquets, pressure bandages, wound packing, and chest seals. In a scenario setting, students will demonstrate the use of tourniquets, pressure bandages, wound packing, and chest seals.

Course Goals: *Determine of a person is sick or not *Identify diabetes hyper/hypo/DKA *Identify & demonstrate NARCAN administration *Identify & demonstrate: recovery positions, burning process and bleeding issues *In a scenario, demonstrate the use of: one-handed & two-handed tourniquet application, emergency bandages and wound packing *In a scenario, demonstrate lifts, carries & drags as discussed in class.
